**4<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL ROSE'S LEGACY GOLF TOURNAMENT  
WILL RAISE MONEY FOR BREAST CANCER**

**WETHERSFIELD - June 5, 2009** - On June 15, Employee Family Protection Incorporated (EFP) will host its annual Rose's Legacy Golf Tournament in support of breast cancer awareness. The tournament, now in its fourth year, is held in memory of Rose Tomaino, a former EFP employee. More than 120 golfers are expected at the Wethersfield Country Club.

More than three years ago, EFP lost Rose, one of their founding employees and vice president of administration, after a long struggle with breast cancer. She had contributed to the growth of the company for more than twenty-five years.

"Rose developed, built and managed our administrative department," said Charles Stepnowski, president and CEO of EFP. "She was a loyal confidant, friend and supporter and was a very special person to many, in many ways. This event is a small step in keeping her spirit with us."

One of Rose's many passions was the game of golf, and EFP founded the annual golf tournament for her friends and colleagues to celebrate and honor her. "The tournament provides us with a place to remember her, and share stories of her exploits," Stepnowski said. "It's also a way for us to raise serious dollars for breast cancer research."

The money raised each year is donated to the Connecticut Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure<sup>®</sup>, where it is invested in local education, screening and treatment programs throughout Connecticut and national research initiatives.
